Dear Fellow Priests and Deacons My fraternal greetings to you all!

ollowing the spike in cases of COVID-19 and subsequent lockdown, we are forced once again to isolate physically from one another. Yet, as I said last year, we must be vigilant that 'social distancing' does not become synonymous with 'distancing socially'. As priests we have a particular obligation to reach out to those in need and in isolation, whether clergy or lay, and to bring together the Body of Christ in spirit, if not in body.

As I said at our recent Zoom catch up, I want to reinforce the importance of caring for, and assisting, Parish staff during this time: you might also make time to keep up with Parish staff either in person if they come in, or by Facetime or phone; time to check in with the principal of school (schools are under a lot of pressure); spend time contacting parishioners by phone; time reading and preparing a short homily for a livestream Mass.

As always please be assured of my continuing prayers for you all.

Greetings from Domus Australia!

I arrived here on 15th October to go into isolation and luckily for only 10 days. Monsignor John Boyle passed the baton to me on 26 October. However, Rome and much of Italy was in lockdown so at Domus we had no guests and were running on a skeleton staff.

Now, as we enjoy summer, Italy is doing well with its vaccination programme. Due to Italians getting vaccinated, Italy is at the beach or gone to the mountains or sightseeing and Domus has welcomed many guests even as far afield as Los Angeles, California and Chicago, Illinois. However,

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
most of the guests are Europeans especially Italians, visiting Rome.

I am enjoying my time here looking after the Priests studying in Rome which we are down to two, namely, Fr Luca Infantino and Fr Sebastian Hew and the three seminarians namely, Bijoy Joseph, Justin Faehrmann and Justin Sofatzis at the PNAC. Bijoy Joseph will be ordained to the Diaconate late September in St Peter's.

We have a Saturday Night Vigil Mass which Fr Luca was celebrating and I concelebrated but now we take it in turns due to losing Fr Jonathan Vala and Deacon Adi Indra. Adi was ordained, Priest, in Bendigo on 10th July. Fr Sebastian has been Principal Celebrant when his studies permit him to join us.

They can all speak Italian so they would come and join us for Mass and then, after Mass stay for dinner. Dinner, Saturday nights is 'pizza and beer night' and anyone is welcome not just from the Archdiocese but from the other Archdioceses and Dioceses as well. Some of our staff would join us as well. It was a good gathering and everyone enjoyed the evening.

Cardinal Pell is a frequent visitor on a Wednesday night with his assistant Fr. Bob Hayes, Rector



Fr Joseph Hamilton. To make up numbers I would invite Priests from the other Archdioceses or Dioceses or some of the Religious Clergy who are posted to Rome as Superior-Generals or Consultors for their Orders.

Another tradition that happens is "The Anzac Group" made up of Priests, Sisters and Brothers attached to their Orders here. After 15 months in and out of lockdown we held the first gathering here at Domus with 32 attending including HE Chiara Porro, The Australian Ambassador to the Holy See and her husband and two sons. It was a wonderful gathering and everyone was delighted to catch-up and know that all were safe and well.

The two Ambassadors, HE Chiara Porro to the Holy See and HE Margaret Twomey Ambassador to Italy have been made welcome at Domus on several occasions and it's good to know them and be involved with them.

It's Wednesday afternoon as I put this together and tonight Fr Luca and I are having the MSC Priests over for dinner. Fr Tim Brennan MSC whom some may know and Fr Chris Chaplin and Fr Mike from USA.

The General Manager, Signor Fabrizio Petrocchi, his secretary, Maria Gambiotti and staff are very committed



to Domus and if you check the website guests who leave comments are full of praise for Domus and the staff.

I know you are in lockdown in NSW and in other states as I type this to you just to remind you and your parishioners that we are here once Qantas can fly out of Australia.

CAS Clergy Retreat St Joseph's Centre, Baulkham Hills 26 September to 1 October 2021



Dear Fathers,

"If Jesus could walk through the doors of the upper room, then He can come through the doors of our lockdown, and come through the locked doors of our hearts". Our team has seen so much evidence for the truth of this comment, which was made on a recent retreat hosted in collaboration with the Dominican Sisters of St Cecilia.

Engagement with recent Parish renewal offerings has been an encouraging sign of the desire of our people to contribute to the growth of their parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ. Over 15 Parishes have requested support to undertake discernment and strategic planning for the spiritual renewal of their Parish. Over 130 people have already signed up for our online Christ-centred leadership series. We have seen attendance of 450 at online retreats offered during lockdown contemplating the gift of discipleship and the call to mission. 30 Family Educators have attended formation with us our team on evangelising families, with eight preparing to launch online offerings for families during lockdown.

Instead of lockdown being a period where Parish renewal pauses or even stalls, we want to provide your people with opportunities which can nourish them for the task of renewal ahead. Below are some offering which we ask you to share with your staff and parishioners.

Go Make Disciples Online Lay Leadership Series – "Christ-centred Leadership"

This online leadership formation series offers essential spiritual formation to lay people exercising a specific responsibility in their Parish and those seeking to serve. Bishop Richard Umbers will join us for the first evening to and pray with those attending the series and to introduce Fr David Braithwaite SJ who will lead the series. Fr Braithwaite is the Asia Coordinator of the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network and founder of The Cardoner Project. The series is helpful for catechists, sacramental coordinators, members of pastoral councils and finance committee, parents, Parish staff, Family Educators, teachers, and those aspiring to leadership.

PLENARY COUNCIL

News from the Plenary Council Working Group

October Assembly

Preparations are underway in the NSW dioceses for the October Assembly in Sydney. The Assembly will be based in the Cathedral precinct with members being accommodated at the Boulevarde Hotel.

The National Plenary Council Team has organised training sessions for all members to familiarise them with both the process for discernment as well as the technical aspects of operating within the Teams online platform, which will connect all hubs across Australia during the Assembly.

Zoom meeting with Clergy

A zoom meeting was held on July 22 for all priests to update them on the Plenary Council. It provided an opportunity for priests to be briefed on the progress of preparations within the Sydney Archdiocese for the first Assembly and beyond into 2022. The meeting was led by Sr Jo



Brady, Plenary Council Liaison Officer and Co-Chairs, Bishop Brady and Professor Sandy Lynch. It was fortunate that Lana Turvey-Collins, National Team Facilitator, was also available to respond to any question that the clergy had.

Engagement with the Parishes

The proposed gathering for Parish Ambassadors which was organised for July 3 with Br Ian Cribb was postponed to August 28 because of the lockdown. We are mindful of the difficulties in maintaining the momentum in the lead up to the Assembly, so a series of emails have been sent to the Parish Ambassadors to keep them abreast of the recent developments and to provide articles for reflection.

It was hoped that the input from Br Ian Cribb SJ on Spiritual Conversations would provide a process for discussion and comment on the Assembly Agenda in parishes, but this will not occur in time for the collation of feedback. Consequently, a proforma for feedback was emailed on July 23 to all Ambassadors, Parishes and others who may be able to encourage responses from the faithful. (Please see attachment)
At this stage we are uncertain if Parish groups will be able to gather, but we are hopeful that the distribution of the proforma will stimulate responses and result in sufficient feedback.

The collated feedback will be forwarded to the Archbishop, National Plenary Council Team and Parish Ambassadors in September.

The Plenary Council Working Group (PCWG) is here to assist Parish Priests in having ownership and interest in the Council so that they feel confident to facilitate engagement with the Council process in their parishes. Please contact the PCWG via **Sr. Jo Brady (jo.brady@sydneycatholic.org)** if we can be of assistance to you.

Let us continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will inspire us all as we prepare for the Assembly.

Italian Institute For Classical Studies

Lingua Ecclesiae is the first intensive summer Latin course specifically designed for ecclesiastics.

Students will be hosted at the Casa per ferie Mater Mundi, run by the Augustinian Sisters of Divine Love. Pedagogical activities are accompanied by the daily celebration of the Liturgy.

To favor the students' rapid and solid learning, all courses are conducted directly in Latin, just like all other daily activities: Latin is the only language of communication within the residence throughout the entire month of stay.

Pedagogical activities are subdivided into those that are part of the curriculum (where participation is required) and those that are optional.

The Lingua Latina course is structured in three classes: Basic, Intermediate, Advanced.

The students will be required to take an entrance test in order to be placed in the more appropriate group.

Social Justice Statement 2021–2022 - Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor

The Social Justice Statement 2021-22 provides theological foundations to ground and inspire efforts to care for creation while responding to the needs of the disadvantaged and excluded. The Statement, which has been approved by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference reflects on creation in and through the Trinity; the sacramentality of all created things; the wonder and beauty available to the contemplative eye; and the need for conversion and change of life. In the Statement, the Bishops invite the whole Catholic community to join them in taking up Pope Francis' invitation to a seven-year journey towards total ecological sustainability, guided by seven Laudato Si' Goals.

The Statement will be launched online, register here: on 5th August in the lead up to Social Justice Sunday on 29th August 2021.

Each Parish will receive two hard copies of the Statement and electronic copies, along with accompanying liturgy notes, prayer cards and action cards can be downloaded from the Office for Social Justice website.

We decided against ordering one for every single priest; it is simply too expensive for something that they are going to throw in the bin and which is available online anyway.

Child-Related Activity Register (WWCC Register)

In March 2020 the Vicar General sent out important information and Fact Sheets to all clergy to inform them about legislative changes relating to Reporting Crimes to the NSW Police, Reportable Conduct Scheme and Mandatory Reporting. The email also included a document called Changes in NSW to the Reportable Conduct Scheme and Mandatory Reporting commencing March 2020 and information on Reportable Crimes obligations that provided you with information not only about legislative changes but also important information about canonical obligations in relation to safeguarding. As you will have read in the documentation, Parish Priest and Administrators need to keep a current Child-Related Activity Parish Register (or WWCC Register) of all those involved in child-related work in the parish which we are aware you already do. You are now required to submit a copy of the Child-Related Activity Register to the Safeguarding Office every six months along with your Visiting Clergy Register. The information required in the Child-Related Activity register is:

- Individuals Full Name
- WWCC Expiry and Verification dates
- WWCC exemptions noted (i.e parent volunteer whose

Obtaining Working With Children Checks (WWCC) from Volunteers.

The Safeguarding Office appreciates all the hard work the Parish Priests and Administrators do within our Parish Communities to ensure Safeguarding requirements are met especially obtaining Working with Children Checks (WWCC).

In 2019 the Safeguarding Office launched the *Fact Sheet: Who needs a Working With Children Check* which provides a list of roles within Parishes that require a WWCC.

We just want to remind Parish Priest and Administrators that not all volunteers need to obtain a WWCC as not all roles within a Parish are deemed as child-related. The Office of the Children's Guardian has advised that there are serious implications in requesting a WWCC from anyone who is not involved in child-related work and we need to ensure that all WWCC's have been obtained and verified appropriately. Below are some examples of volunteer ministries that **do not** require a WWCC:

- Cleaners
- Gardeners
- Choir members
- Finance Committee Members
- Parish Council Members
- Audio Visual
- Piety Stall Volunteers
- Flower Arrangers
- Offertory procession Volunteers
- Hospitality Workers
