Dear Fellow Priests and Deacons My fraternal greetings to you all!

ast week we celebrated the First Assembly of the fifth such council of Australia. It was an extraordinary week, as Council Members sought to discern the voice of the Holy Spirit in all the submissions and preparatory documents of the Council, in their spiritual conversations, small group discussions and plenary interventions, in their prayers and occasional silences.

All sorts of things came up this week past: some imaginative and wise, some unhelpful or even impossible. In the Parallel Plenary Council conducted in some parts of the media over recent months and days, God has rarely been mentioned, or prayer, sacraments, vocation, holiness, saints, communion with the Church.

But if Jesus, the Word made flesh, is the Good Teacher to whom we bring all our questions, including the sixteen on the Plenary Council agenda; if His is the wisdom we seek to discern and apply, as the Bishops and their colleagues seek to discern among the many voices, then all will be well.

If as a Church in Australia we can keep the commandments and repent when we fail, if we can let go of every possession or privilege, ideology or attachment, structure or aspiration that gets in the way of the adventure of the Gospel, then the hearts of the faithful and the Church in Australia may truly be renewed.

We continue to listen to God speaking in the Word of Scripture, in the Divine Liturgy and in the members of the Church, and implore His guidance in the months ahead. I ask you to keep the Council members in your own prayers as well.

As we approach 80% double dose vaccination rates, we look forward to the re-opening of our churches, and welcoming back our flock. I ask you to join me in praying for a strong return of our flock.

As always please be assured of my continuing prayers for you all.

Cenacles of Prayer for Clergy

For over 40 years priests have been meeting in Sydney in cenacles of prayer. They began in the Blessed Sacrament chapel in Haymarket in 1980, and have been successively based in Surry Hills, Parramatta Cathedral, St. John's Park, the Slovenian church in Merrylands, MSC Monastery, Kensington, and, till lockdown, in St. Bernadette's, Carlton. They have now moved to zoom and are hosted from Canberra by Fr Emil Milat. This means priests can join from anywhere.

The name "Cenacle" comes from the room where Mary and the Apostles waited and prayed for the coming of the Holy Spirit. These cenacles consist of a short invocation of the Holy Spirit, a rosary, prayers for the intentions of the Pope, a reading and an act of consecration to the Immaculate Heart



of Mary. It takes about 40 minutes and, when it was live, was usually followed by fellowship with tea, coffee and snacks.

The online cenacles are held on the 13th of the month at 2pm.

Sydney Centre for Evangelisation

As we slowly emerge from a three-and-a-half-month lockdown, we are conscious that the return to the new normal will take some time as our parishes, teams and agencies re-find their feet after the challenges of isolation and limitation, experienced in a variety of ways.

One of the brighter legacies of this period of lockdown has been the tremendous online engagement with spiritual initiatives over this time, expressing a desire among Sydney Catholics to remain connected with others and to find hope and nourishment in what have been challenging circumstances. This was underscored recently when some 120 participants from Sydney and beyond gathered online for a facilitated evening of intercessory prayer, for our priests and parishes of Sydney as they prepare for re-opening.

In a similar vein, we are also excited to announce that we have secured Bishop Robert Barron to speak at and launch a new series on evangelisation that our Sydney Centre for Evangelisation is offering online. Bishop Barron will be speaking to us on the call at the heart of the Gospel: the mission to 'go make disciples' as echoed by our Archdiocesan Mission Plan and so well supported by our Parish Renewal Team.

The weeks ahead will also see us gather with parish sacramental coordinators for a retreat day as these pastoral leaders are critical to the evangelisation of families and children who approach the Church with openness to the Gospel and a desire for full initiation into the life of the Church.

With our churches soon to re-open, we also thank a number of priests who have recorded welcome messages to encourage people back to the Eucharist and our communities via social media. We have been blessed by their support and generosity. We will also this year be producing Advent resources to further encourage a renewed sense of shared prayer and community in local parishes and communities following these past months of isolation. We can only hope for a more stable path to Christmas; thank you for your ongoing support.

Bishop Robert Barron and Dr Mary Healy to Address Sydney in new series

In November we have two big opportunities which have been created to support you in engaging your parishioners in spiritual conversations about discipleship and how we live this more fully in our parish communities.

The first is new monthly series offered online called 'Reclaiming Evangelisation: How Jesus Great Commission Will Renew Our Parishes'. With Archbishop Fisher present, Bishop Robert Baron will launch the online series on Saturday 13th November via Zoom with a talk entitled 'Why Make Disciples?

The case for the evangelising mission of the Church'. In support of the Archdiocesan mission plan Go Make Disciples, the series will make the case that Catholic communities are renewed when we seek to live more fully the mission given to us by our Lord, to call disciples, baptise them, and teach them. Each talk will be followed by Q&A with the speakers as well as the by the opportunity for small group discussions.

The series will continue in early 2022 with an address by Dr Mary Healy, an international speaker and a professor of Sacred Scripture at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. Read more here

After the positive feedback about this year's Lenten Companion, the Parish Renewal Team is developing an Advent companion for our parishes: Rejoice! Receiving and Sharing the Gift of the Good News. The booklet, which will be available for download in the weeks prior to Advent, will contain the Gospel readings for the Sundays of Advent and Christmas Day, reflections from Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP, Professor Tracey Rowland and others, questions for discussion groups, and other resources for Advent. The Parish Renewal Team will also be offering online workshops about how to lead an Advent group in person or online. The workshop can be attended on 27 October, 28 October, or 4 November.

As we begin to physically gather again for worship and community life, I pray this will be a time of joy and spiritual fruitfulness in your communities.

I hope and pray that these practical offerings will support you as you seek to lead your people in the spiritual renewal of your parish community.





National Mental Health Month

October marks the start of National Mental Health Month, this year's theme is 'Mental Health: Post Pandemic Recovery Challenges and Resilience' Ministering to those who suffer from mental illness is an essential part of the pastoral care of the church. Mental health can strike deep within a human, impacting and affecting all aspects of their life - work, family, relationships, prayer and even their relationship with God.



During this month the Safeguarding Office recognises how import Self-Care is, especially during these difficult times. As a member of clergy you are called to be sources of hope, strength and healing for those struggling with mental health and trauma, just as looking after these individuals is important, it is also important for you to look after yourself.

Steven Hobfoll, in his article, 'Five Essential Elements of Immediate and Mid-Term Mass Trauma Intervention: Empirical Evidence', offers five essential elements of intervention to help look after yourself:

- 1. Safety
- 2. Calm
- 3. Connection
- 4. Self and Collective Efficacy
- 5. Hope

Safety - helps to reduce the impact of both the biological responses to trauma and the cognitive inhibitors of recovery. Providing a safe environment for yourself is key to self-care.

Calm - Promoting a calming and regulating environment it will help to reduce anxiety levels and leave you feeling calmer within yourself.

Connection - connectedness is essential for creating a sense of belonging. During Covid many may have felt that they lost their sense of connection. During times when restrictions ease, it is great opportunity to invest in relationships and strengthen connections with family and friends.

Self and Collective Efficacy - this concept is based on the belief that there are circumstances within our control and that decisions and actions we take can and do lead to positive outcomes. Self-efficacy cannot be fostered alone it requires collaboration.

Hope - Hope is something that an individual and a community can actively cultivate. It is important to try and latch on to the smallest moments of success and positivity that come our way.

The World Health Organisation defines mental wellbeing as "a state in which every individual realises his or her own potential, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and fruitfully, and is able to make a contribution to her or his community"

The Safeguarding Office has developed a Self-Care Plan which has been designed to assist you in identifying strategies to take care of yourself physically, emotionally and spiritually. Because taking care of your overall sense of wellbeing is important.

New Safeguarding Changes to Canon Law

From 8 December 2021 there will be a number of new changes to Canon Law concerning safeguarding. The changes are in "Book VI: Penal Sanctions in the Church," of the Vatican's Code of Canon Law.


The changes are a result of more than a decade's work to revise the Code and strengthen the provisions for those who commit sexual offences. Changes concerning safeguarding are outlined in a new chapter - *Title VI - Offences against human life, dignity and liberty.*

The revisions have been informed by and reflect victims and survivors of abuse, which is making the Church aware and responsible by introducing changes to canonical provisions which can support the healing process involved by the whole ecclesial community.

Key revisions:

- Requirement that offences must be reported and that bishops and religious superiors respond to these reports by making use of the Church's penal procedures. Bishops can now be removed for failing to report suspected crimes to Church Authorities
- Recognition that adults as well as children can be victimised by clergy who abuse power — canonical crimes relating to minors and a person who "habitually has an imperfect use of reason or with one to whom the law recognises equal protection" are established in a specific canon.
- Expanding the application of canons dealing with abuse to religious and laypeople who have a role, office or function in the Church — not just to clergy but to "any

one of the faithful who enjoys a dignity or performs an office or function in the Church"
